

SJ business outlook session at Rutgers

A panel of industry leaders will forecast what bodes for the Southern New Jersey economy in the second quarter of '06 at the Rutgers-Camden Quarterly Business Outlook, moderated by Rutgers University School of Business-Camden Dean Mitchell Koza, on Tuesday, April 25, from 8 to 9:30 a.m., at the Clarion Hotel and Conference Center in Cherry Hill.

Now in its 11th year as an economic barometer for South Jersey, the breakfast conference, sponsored by the Rutgers University School of Business-Camden, evaluates the region's health by examining key South Jersey industries.
